


NOVEMBER 2023 TIP SUMMARY


In November 2023, Courage2Report received **150** tips.

Compared to last year, (127 tips in November 2022), we saw an **18%** increase.

Bullying was the number one most reported tip type this month, last November the most reported tip type was School Shooting Threats.



In the month of November, Wednesday was the day of the week with the most tips reported. This was also the day with the most tips reported in October.

In November, the busiest time of day was 4:00 PM.



November Tips by Method of Submission

Reporting from a computer's browser was the preferred way to submit tips in November.

Handle With Care (HWC)

In November 2023, we received **23** HandleWithCare tips.

Since the beginning of this year (January 2023 – November 2023), we received a total of **268** HandleWithCare tips.

As time progresses, more counties are joining the HandleWithCare program. If a law enforcement officer encounters a child during a call, that child's information is forwarded to the school before the school bell rings the next day. The school implements individual, class and whole school trauma-sensitive curricula so that traumatized children are "Handled With Care". If a child needs more intervention, on-site trauma-focused mental healthcare is available at the school.

Training Opportunity

Responding to and Investigating Bomb Threats and Swatting Hoaxes

Presented and Hosted by: FBI Boston and Massachusetts State Police

This one-hour training provides attendees an overview of the realities of bomb threats and swatting hoaxes and includes a detailed review of statistics and current trends seen across the country. The training will also cover the characteristics of hoax calls, law enforcement best practices for assessment and response, and the decision-making process for evacuation or sheltering in place.

Change in Missouri Legislation (Sunshine Law)

Effective - 28 Aug 2023

A new statute has been added to **RSMo 610.021** which covers "Closed meetings and closed records authorized when, exceptions."

Section 18, subsection (b) was added and states, "Any information or data provided to a tip line for the purpose of safety or security at an educational institution that, if disclosed, has the potential to endanger the health or safety of an individual or the public."

Section 18, subsection (c) states, "Any information contained in any suspicious activity report provided to law enforcement that, if disclosed, has the potential to endanger the health or safety of an individual or the public."

Relevancy: All Courage2Report tips have additional protection from open record requests such as Missouri's Sunshine Law and the Freedom of Information Act.
